Oak Hill Road Construction Update

Oak Hill Road Construction continues in earnest on the bridge over Pigeon Creek. Additional drainage piping has been laid to drain storm water into Pigeon Creek, and new sidewalks for the bridge are being poured. Drivers on Oak Hill should take note that the speed limit signs approaching the Pigeon Creek Bridge have been updated to 25 mph during construction.

Crown Pointe Subdivision Road Construction Set to Begin in July

The City Engineers office has reported that road repairs will begin within Crown Pointe Subdivision beginning in Mid-July, and last for approximately 30 days. The repairs are necessary prior to City acceptance of the roads within the subdivision. Once the road repairs are completed, the City Engineer can recommend the subdivision streets for acceptance.

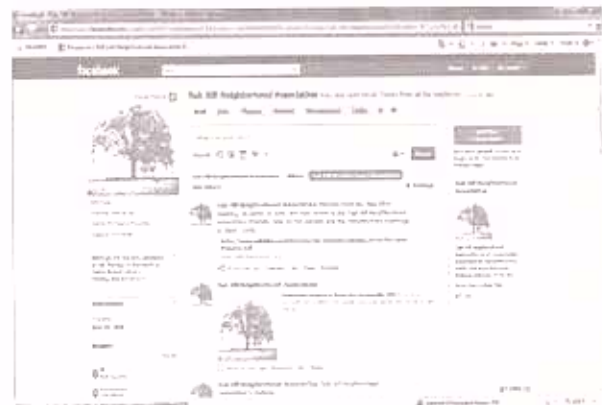
Oak Hill Neighborhood Launches New Website and Facebook Page
