First was in Oak Hill Woods area, wire from electric line hanging down into street residents made numerous phone calls to get problem corrected, 12 hours later wire was still there. Residents were not quite sure when it was finally resolved. Continuing problem with Ron Gibson's property on N Court, Pool not covered and polluted along with other problems. Anna has contacted code enforcement, thought they were taking care of it she has done everything she can. Kevin Kenny suggested calling or emailing John Friend, City Councilman.

Traffic problem on and going west on Lynch. CPO will check into it.

CPO Gray had some information on Citizen's Academy thru Evansville Police Dept, Bob who has gone through this program a couple of times added that it was a very good and interesting program. Roger will post information on web site about this program.

CPO also discussed phone scam known as "Officer down" asking for donations for families of fallen police officers. Do not donate as it is a scam. The FOP representatives also making calls, these are legitimate.

Susan Harp has found "Children at Play" signs at Rural King for \$14, needs to figure out how to put one up.

Discussions about bridge and road work. Pat Keepes, City Engineer said different supervisors have different ways of doing things when asked why they didn't complete one side before working on other side. Still no street work by Vogel school except there is a turn lane on Morgan to get into parking lot at the school. It was suggested talking to Mayor at a Town Hall Meeting. Keepes guarantees will not flood.
